Aims/ Objectives	The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), which came into force on 25th May 2018, revolutionised personal data protection law across the EU. It requires companies and organisations of all sizes to ensure compliance and safeguard personal data and privacy.
	This seminar will provide a clear and practical understanding of GDPR requirements, focusing on how SMEs can apply them effectively in their daily operations.

Apply best practices, guidelines, and policies in daily operations
